

**ORDINANCE 2014-03**

**ORDINANCE APPROVING ADDITION TO ORDINANCE CHAPTER 48 TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES; ARTICLE V, PARKING; SECTION 48-220 AREAS RESTRICTED TO NO PARKING AT ANY TIME**

The Town Board of the Town of Windsor, Dane County, Wisconsin, do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Section 48-220(a)(20) of the Town of Windsor Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

Section 48-220(a)(20) On Portage Road, east and west sides of road, from Gray Road north to 7000 Portage Road.


2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.





**Sec. 48-220. Areas restricted to no parking at any time.**

- (a) *Parking restrictions.* No person shall at any time park or leave standing any vehicle:
- (1) Within an intersection.
  - (2) On a crosswalk.
  - (3) On a path or terrace area, except when parking in such place is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers or parking meters. The term "terrace or path area" means that area between the path and the nearest curb line running parallel or generally parallel thereto or in the absence of a path ten feet beyond the curb line.
  - (4) Alongside or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction when such stopping or standing would obstruct traffic or when pedestrian traffic would be required to travel in the roadway.
  - (5) On the roadway side of any parked vehicle unless double parking is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers.
  - (6) Within a fire lane consisting of either the driveway between the front doors of a fire station and the public road or in such places properly designated and marked as fire lanes ordered by the Fire Chief.
  - (7) Upon any portion of a highway where and at the time when stopping or standing is prohibited by official traffic signs indicating the prohibition of any stopping or standing.
  - (8) In any place or manner so as to obstruct, block or impede traffic.
  - (9) Within ten feet of a fire hydrant, unless a greater distance is indicated by an official traffic sign.
  - (10) Upon any portion of a highway where and at the time when parking is prohibited, limited or restricted by official traffic signs.
  - (11) Upon any bridge.
  - (12) Upon any Town road, any vehicle which faces a direction different from the direction of normal traffic flow for the lane of traffic in which said vehicle is stopped or standing.
  - (13) Upon any Town terrace or path.
  - (14) In a loading zone.
  - (15) Within six feet of the entrance to an alley, private road or driveway.
  - (16) In any municipal park when said park is closed to the public.
  - (17) The odd-numbered side of Fairway Circle between both intersections of Golf Road.
  - (18) On Windsor Road, north side, from Wolf Hollow Road, westerly for 500 feet, between the hours of 7:45 a.m. to 8:15 a.m. and 2:30 to 3:15 p.m., Monday through Friday.
  - (19) On Windsor Road, south side, from Wolf Hollow Road, westerly for 500 feet, between the hours of 7:45 a.m. to 8:15 a.m. and 2:30 to 3:15 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- (b) *Exemptions.* Restrictions in subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to the actual loading or unloading or receiving or discharging passengers or property and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may be moved promptly in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic.
