TOWN OF WINDSOR SPECIAL TOWN BOARD MEETINGS

The enclosed May 16th, 2014 press release “Windsor to Analyze Future Governmental Structure” noted that the Town of Windsor Board is “growing forward” by considering options for the structure of its local governmental operation while continuing to work cooperatively with our neighbors.

The Town Board is examining the benefits, impacts and issues related to the following options:

1. Windsor remains a town and makes no major structural changes in its form of government.
2. Windsor creates a new governmental entity with the Village of DeForest through merger or consolidation.
3. Windsor incorporates and changes its government from a town to a village.

The Board has established four listening sessions to discuss the above options and provide due diligence through the information gathering process. No formal studies or analysis have been ordered by the Board, or are available for review. The sessions are an opportunity for the general public to provide input on the future of Windsor and attendees shouldn't expect to walk away with all their questions answered at these meetings.

There is a discussion focus for each meeting; however, they are all open to the public for participation.
