[2] Advanced Disposal offers curbside pick up for many bulk items for a fee. Residents can contact Advanced Disposal directly to arrange for curbside pickup. Dane County's website also offers a list of five businesses that will accept appliances. Residents would need to call for details. [3] Paint can be thrown in a trash cart as long as it is dried out with cat litter inside of the can (Oil based paint can be taken to Clean Sweep for disposal)

[4] Clean Sweep accepts hazardous household materials such as Oil-Based Paints and Paint-Related Products, Pesticides & Poisons, Household Products Containing Organic Solvents, Ignitables, and Aerosols, and Rechargeable Batteries. Clean Sweep collects these items for a fee and is located at 7102 US 12, Madison WI 53718. (<http://www.danecountycleansweep.com/household/Household-Disposal>)

[5] Lead/Acid Automotive Type Batteries: Clean Sweep, Any place that sells them, All Metals Recycling, Batteries Plus. Other Rechargeable Batteries: Clean Sweep, Batteries Plus, Radio Shack. Alkaline & Other Disposables: Throw in your trash.

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION ITEMS NOT TO BE PLACED IN ADVANCED DISPOSAL CARTS

Item	Where to Recycle
Paints	Curbside Pick Up (Trash Cart) [3]
Cleansers	Flush liquids down your sanitary sewer one at a time. Throw solids in your trash.
Motor Oil	Windsor Recycling Center
Fertilizers	Clean Sweep [4]
Fluorescent Bulbs	Over 30 retailers in Dane County Accept (may collect a fee)
Aerosol Cans	Clean Sweep [4] (Empty aerosol cans go in with your recyclables cart, caps off)
Batteries	See note [5]
Insecticides	Clean Sweep [4]
Sharps Disposal	Currently 58 Facilities in Dane County accept sharps [6]

Containers	
Curbside Pick Up (Recycling Cart)	#1 and #2 plastics, bottles and jars Bi-metal cans and containers Glass containers Steel (tin) cans and containers Aluminum containers

Paper and cardboard	
Curbside Pick Up (Recycling Cart)	Corrugated cardboard Magazines, catalogs and other materials on similar paper Newspaper and newsprint materials Office paper
